


Preparing Soil (Establishing Need)

Fertilizing & Nourishing (Progress)

- Teaching 14 new recruits on-going in Bangor, Holywood, Drumbo, Enniskillen, Rostrevor.
- L the R passes Level 1 achieved or nearly achieved by approx 30 pupils.
- L the R passes Level 2 work in progress
- M1 and M2 courses planned for 2019
- Workshops planned for striking, change-ringing and tower management.
- District practices as recruitment tool in advanced publicity



Leicestershire & North Lancs/South Lakes

Leicestershire: Accreditation Sessions arranged, M1 and M2 refresher workshop in development and new M1 & M2 courses arranged.

Cooperation with neighbouring counties. ART publicity on LDG website and advertising courses etc in Guild newsletter.

North Lancs/South Lakes: M1 course run for first time in November in Lancaster. Youngest participant was 18 and at Uni of Cumbria, other ringers from all over the patch.

Lytham St Anne's goes from strength to strength with its third course in the pipeline! Flookborough has its first ever course booked for May.

BIG THANK YOU to mentors and teachers who are coming in from the surrounding areas such as Carlise and Derbyshire.
