

Reverse Canterbury Minimus

Purpose

Reverse Canterbury Minimus has the same, familiar treble passing signposts as Plain Bob Minimus.

New skills include making thirds place *wrong,* making three blows at the back, and a new type of start for third and fourth place bells.

Ringing Reverse Canterbury Minimus

The treble plain hunts.

Third place bell starts by making an extra blow in third place and goes into the lead.

Fourth place bell starts by making two extra blows in fourth place and hunts down to the lead.

When the treble takes you off the lead, make seconds and lead again.

If the treble is passed at the back, make three blows in fourth place, two in thirds, then hunt down to the lead.

When the treble is passed in 2-3 on the way up, make two blows in third place, then three at the back in fourth place.

On finishing three blows at the back, if the treble appears as the next bell, hunt straight to the lead. The treble will then take you off the lead, so make seconds.

Jargon

Wrong places are when the first blow of the places is made at backstroke, and the second blow at handstroke.

Making wrong places can feel strange.
