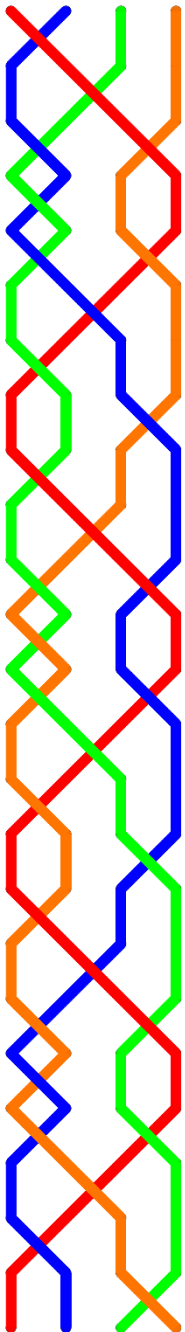


St Nicholas Minimus



Purpose

St Nicholas Minimus introduces a new type of frontwork, which includes both places and dodges.

There are clear treble signposts.

Places are made in thirds which may be a new skill.

Ringing St Nicholas Minimus

The treble plain hunts.

On arriving at the front, dodge in 1-2, then *lead full* and wait for the treble to lead.

If the treble takes your bell off the lead, make seconds, then *lead full* and dodge in 1-2.

On the way to the back, make two blows in thirds place and three blows in fourth place.

At the back, when the treble appears in fourth place, make two blows under it in thirds place, then three blows in fourths place, two blows thirds place, then hunt to the lead.

Jargon

Lead full means to lead for two blows.

Frontwork is a piece of work done in the front two places of the row.

Wrong places are when the first blow of the places is made at backstroke and the second blow at handstroke.

Making *wrong* places can feel strange.
