


Grandsire Doubles – plain course



Purpose

Grandsire Doubles is a *twin hunt* method. In the plain course, the treble and 2 both plain hunt. Apart from the treble, the other bell plain hunting is known as the *hunt bell*. In a plain course, only the 3, 4, and 5 are working bells.


At only 30 changes long, the plain course comes back into rounds quite quickly.

When ringing Grandsire Doubles, treble signposts are particularly useful.

Ringling a plain course of Grandsire Doubles

The treble and 2 plain hunt.

Bells 3, 4 and 5 ring a cycle of work: dodge 4-5 down, dodge 4-5 up, make thirds.



Treble signposts

If the treble takes your bell off lead, make two blows in thirds place and return to lead.

- If your bell passes the treble in 2-3, dodge 4-5 up
- If your bell passes the treble in 3-4, dodge 4-5 down
- If your bell passes the treble in 4-5, you are the hunt bell

Tip: After your bell has passed the treble, the next bell you pass is always the hunt bell.

The work of the 3 (place bells are marked)
