

Plain Hunt Worksheet

How to write out Plain Hunt

- Write out line by line.
- Put the 2 into the lead (as shown).
- Each bell leads for two blows.
- Then every bell that can swap, change place, crosses with the following bell.
- Continue as above until you get back into rounds.

(On five bells)

(On six bells)

When you have finished use a red pen to join the treble line up.

Use a different colour to join the path of the other bells.

Course bells and after bells

As bells change places and hunt up or down, they *follow* each other in a certain order and meet other bells in predictable places.

- Your *course bell* is the bell you follow down to the lead.
- You ring over/after it in second place before you lead.
- You lead after that bell, you *take it off the lead* or *turn it from the lead*.
- You also ring after your course bell on your first blow at the back.
- Your *after bell* is the bell that follows you down to lead, you ring over it in second place, when you come off the lead.
- It *takes you off the lead* or *turns you from the lead*.

Who is coursing whom?

Bell 4 is coursing bell

Bell 3 is coursing bell

Bell 5 is coursing bell
